We are continuing to study both Alternatives A and B as part of the Draft Environmental Impact Statement (Draft EIS). Currently, we are drafting chapters of the Draft EIS document and conducting a detailed analysis on impacts such as noise, water quality, and air quality. The result of this in-depth analysis will be reflected in the Draft EIS and available for public comment and at public hearings this fall 2012. A final decision is not expected until 2013.

Mayor's Message



Information, Communication and Meetings

Over the past couple of years, I have noticed that one of the biggest challenges we have in West Point City is that of keeping the residents informed and updated with the news and event's that occur in the city. Between our recreation programs, service changes, or just information in general; communication continues to be a big challenge. Some of you read the newsletters and many don't, some pass by the gateway sign on 300 North, and others just don't travel that way. I thought I would focus this month's message on the many methods the city uses to distribute information, as well as a general rundown on our city meeting schedules. It was very evident the last few months as we rolled out our general recycling program that we are not informing the residents the way we would like to.

**Newsletter:** If you are reading this right now you already know that the newsletter is a great way to find out about what is going on in the city from month to month. It is also important to take note of your monthly bill, as it will inform you of any changes or oversights that may have taken place. For those of you who are on automatic bill pay, it is still important to review your bill and ensure the payment information is current, it will help you avoid getting a water shutoff notice.....I am speaking from experience!

**Gateway Sign and Website** If you travel west on 300 North several times a week, you can get a pretty good idea of current events and information on the electronic sign. However, unless you drive by very slowly it will take a few trips to see all the information posted on the sign. We are increasing our efforts to update information on our website. The website is a great tool for general information and contact information for me and the city council.

**Meetings:** The first and third Tuesday of every month is when we hold our city council meetings. The general meeting starts at 7:00 pm, however, we have an administrative session that starts at 6:00 pm and the public is welcome to that as well. These meetings are generally not too long and are a great way to find out the general business of the city; at every meeting there is a spot on the agenda for public comments. The Planning Commission meets on the second and fourth Thursdays of every month; they typically discuss land use issues, review conditional use permits, and any other items that pertain to the planning and zoning of our city. The general meeting starts at 7:00 pm and they also have a work session that starts at 6:00 or 6:30 depending on the length of their agenda for the evening. The agendas for all of these meetings are posted on the front door of city hall and they are also listed in the Standard Examiner.

We live in the information age, with Facebook, Twitter, email, text messaging and others we are always looking at ways we can improve communication with the residents and keep the information flowing. I personally love hearing from you, whether it is a concern or a question; I am a firm believer that we can improve and learn from the feedback and comments we receive. So feel free to contact me or the council with any of your questions, comments or concerns.

Fireworks and Dry Weather – A Dangerous Mix

We are all aware that fire danger is very high this year. With the exceptionally mild winter, dry spring and very hot temperatures earlier in June, it only reminds us that this year we must all be more careful using fireworks to celebrate the 4<sup>th</sup> and 24<sup>th</sup>.

Wildfires around the state have prompted officials, including Governor Herbert to consider banning the use of all fireworks for this season. While this is a growing possibility, the decision has not been made at this time. Continued monitoring of current conditions may lead to restrictions or a ban of fireworks in West Point. To help West Point have a safe holiday, the North Davis Fire District encourages all residents to use extra caution this year. Be aware of your surroundings including vacant lots or inflammable buildings and materials. Avoid areal fireworks, or better still, leave the fireworks at home and enjoy the display at Loy Blake Park on the evening of the 4<sup>th</sup>.
