West Davis Corridor Update

Over the last few months, the West Davis Corridor EIS team has continued to work with and receive input from residents, agencies, cities, farmers, and many other stakeholders. Additional funding also allowed UDOT to conduct a more detailed analysis of potential wetland areas. This new wetland study included digging over 500 test holes to analyze the presence of hydric soils, one of the three indicators of a wetland area (in addition to vegetation and hydrology). All of this new information has helped the WDC team make refinements to the alternatives in some areas to further minimize impacts.

To help inform the public on this updated information and refined alternatives, we will be presenting at
