WINTER PARKING

Winter Parking regulations are now in effect!

(November 1st to March 1st).

WPC 10.05(H)(1)&(3) states:

“No person shall park any vehicle on any street for any period of time between the hours of 1:00 AM and 6:00 AM of any day, commencing the first day of November of each year and up to and including the last day of February of the following year.”

This regulation is designed to keep streets free of vehicles so that snow plows can efficiently clear the roads without obstructions. Code Enforcement and the Davis County Sheriff’s Office will now be issuing compliance citations for violations.

Please also be aware that pushing or blowing snow onto public streets is prohibited.

As you clear snow, please ensure that the snow stays on your property and is not blown or plowed into the street. Your cooperation in helping the City handle another winter is greatly appreciated!

West Point Military Memorial



I am sure there are many of you who have heard of the Utah Honor Flights, but I am equally sure there are many more who are qualified to participate in an Honor Flight, have not heard of the project, or who do not understand its concept or purpose.

The Utah Honor Flight organization is a nonprofit group who's mission is to take Veterans who served from WWII through the VietNam conflict, free of charge, to Washington, D.C. to see their memorials. The two-day trip is to honor our veterans in appreciation for their service and sacrifice to our Country. The Honor Flight covers air and ground transportation, meals, and hotel costs for the Veteran. Each honoree takes someone with him, called a guardian, who is there to assist and help the veteran in any required capacity. Each guardian does have a fee which covers his airfare, hotel, meals and transportation which will be discussed at the time of selection for a flight. Guardians must be at least 18, in good physical condition, and neither a spouse or significant other. More specific information is available on how to schedule a trip at the Honor Flight's website listed below.

Participation in a flight can be requested and arranged by contacting the Honors group at www.utahhonorflight.org or at (801)309-9362. What greater honor can a Veteran receive than to be hosted on a trip to our Nation's Capital to visit the Memorial's built in tribute of the Veteran's service.
